Beth yw Parêd Gŵyl Dewi Aberystwyth?

Sefydlwyd y Parêd yn 2013 er mwyn dathlu'r Gymraeg a diwrnod ein nawddsant.


Credir i Dewi farw ar 1 Mawrth 589OC gan ddweud, ar ei wely angau, "gwnewch y pethau bychain a glywsoch ac a welsoch gennyf i." Yn ôl proffwydoliaeth 'Armes Prydain' o'r flwyddyn 930 roedd y Cymry i uno a churo'r Saeson "a lluman [baner] glan Dewi â ddyrchafant". Nodir pwysigrwydd Dewi i'r Cymry gan y ffaith i'r Pâb Callixtus II ei gydnabod yn 1120, a cheir sawl lle yn Llydaw sydd wedi eu henwi ar ôl Dewi, megis Landivy a Saint-Divy.

Daeth ei faner, croes felen ar gefndir du, fwy fwy poblogaidd ers dyfodiad y Cynulliad yn 1999. Mae'r golomen a'r genhinen hefyd yn symbolau a gysylltir â Dewi.

What is Parêd Gŵyl Dewi Aberystwyth?

The Parêd is an annual procession to celebrate the Welsh language and culture and our patron saint.

Dewi corresponds to David in English (the other name being Dafydd) and St



David is Wales's patron saint. 'Gŵyl Dewi' (the festival of David) has been celebrated in Wales for hundreds of years but the tradition of a St David's Day parade is very recent – Aberystwyth's Parade began in 2013.

According to the 'Annales Cambriae' Dewi died on 1 March 589AD. On his deathbed he is reputed to have said, "gwnewch y pethau bychain a glywsoch ac a welsoch gennyf i" (do the little things that you have seen me do and heard about). Gwnewch y pethau bychain, 'do the little things', is now a well-known phrase in Welsh.

In the prophetic poem, 'Armes Prydain' of 930AD, the Welsh people would unite behind the standard of David to defeat the Anglo-Saxon; "A lluman glân Dewi a ddyrchafant" ("And they will raise the pure banner of Dewi").

David led a simple life and would refrain from eating meat and drinking beer. He was officially recognized as a saint by Pope Callixtus II in 1120 and several places in Brittany are also named in his honour, Landivy for instance.

His flag, a yellow cross on black background, has become increasingly popular since the advent of the Assembly in 1999. The dove and leek are also symbols associated with David.
